Chris Bischof is currently Assistant Professor of History at the University of Richmond specializing in modern Britain and the world. His research includes a study of the relationship between capitalism, humanitarianism, and the global movement of laborers in the British Empire as well as a history of elementary education and state-making in the British world. He received his PhD from Rutgers University and taught at Rutgers and Franklin and Marshall College before coming to Richmond. He teaches courses on a wide range of topics, including the history of British cities, European imperialism, World War I, and twentieth-century Europe. His research has been published in several major scholarly journals and has been funded by the National Academy of Education and the Mellon Foundation.
